South Sudanese Development and Relief Agency (SSUDRA), South Sudan (Patrick Mulu, SSUDRA General Manager)

Please pray for the people in South Sudan. Floods devastated the country, with around 1.4 million people impacted. There are also mounting concerns over the spread of malaria in flood-hit areas. Please pray that Malaria will not spread and that the fragile healthcare system will be able to support all impacted. We ask that all communities in urgent need of humanitarian intervention will receive what they need quickly. We pray that those who are already malnourished will receive desperately needed food, especially children, those who are pregnant and breastfeeding. Please pray for our partner SSUDRA, who is currently providing emergency relief to communities impacted. Pray that God would give them strength, wisdom and protection as they provide much-needed food, mosquito nets, tents and other necessary services to improve people's living standards.

Diocese of Nampula, Mozambique (Project Leader: Muassite Miguel)

Significant violence has occurred in Nampula, Mozambique, and other cities after Government elections. Our Nampula-based staff are unable to leave their home until the violence and protests subside. al-Ahli Arab Hospital, Gaza (Director: Suhaila Tarazi)

We pray for al-Ahli Arab Hospital, which continues to see a growing number of patients attending the hospital. They are currently seeing around 750 patients a day with minimal supplies and food. Lord, we pray that you will provide hospital staff with the medical equipment, fuel, food, and water needed to support patients. Please continue giving them strength and sheltering them from the danger surrounding them. We give thanks for their service, courage and care. We ask for the release of all captives, and we pray that your peace and justice will prevail over such immense tragedy.
